SECTION 1

Presenting Situation

Dr. Vassel-Prynne (hereinafter: the Subject) submitted the completed measurement of the Moral Exterior on November 14, 2019 – reference C-4412-Ω – and requested an urgent meeting with the Institute's senior leadership to discuss what he described, in correspondence, as "*findings of considerable moral gravity.*"

He used the phrase "considerable moral gravity" three times across four emails. In the third email he underlined it. In the fourth he did not write anything else.

The Institute received all four emails. The Institute noted the underline.

SECTION 2

Initial Response Protocol

A member of the Institute's Wellbeing & Boundary Compliance Division reached out to Dr. Vassel-Prynne on November 18, 2019 to acknowledge receipt of his findings and to inquire about his current emotional state.

"My emotional state is not the relevant variable."

– SUBJECT, IN REPLY. RESPONSE FLAGGED.

An actor who resists inquiry into their emotional state is often, in the Institute's experience, an actor in considerable distress – distress that, unaddressed, can manifest as escalating communication, inappropriate urgency, or what the Division terms Boundary Pressure Events (BPEs). The Subject's subsequent correspondence – eleven emails over six days, each longer than the last, the final one containing three attached appendices and a hand-drawn diagram that has since been archived – is consistent with this assessment.

The Institute wished him well.

The Institute scheduled a call for December 3rd.

The call was rescheduled.

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SECTION 3

Summary of Findings (Abridged)

The Institute has reviewed the executive summary of C-4412-Ω and offers the following summary, which is shorter than the original and has had the mathematics removed for wellness purposes:

The Subject found that the portion of the moral universe for which any given individual bears no accountability is, in precise topological terms, *everything*. The circle of direct responsibility approaches zero. The exterior approaches infinity. The difference between the two was described by the Subject as "not a rounding error."

He also found an event horizon.

He was not looking for an event horizon. He found one anyway.

The Institute acknowledges these findings. The Institute notes that the findings, while technically rigorous, produce significant discomfort when read in full – and under Principle 3, discomfort is a harm event. The findings have therefore been classified as a Boundary Pressure Event of the Second Kind and archived accordingly.

The archive is reference C-4412-Ω. The archive is sealed.

Measurement of the Moral Exterior: Schematic Representation

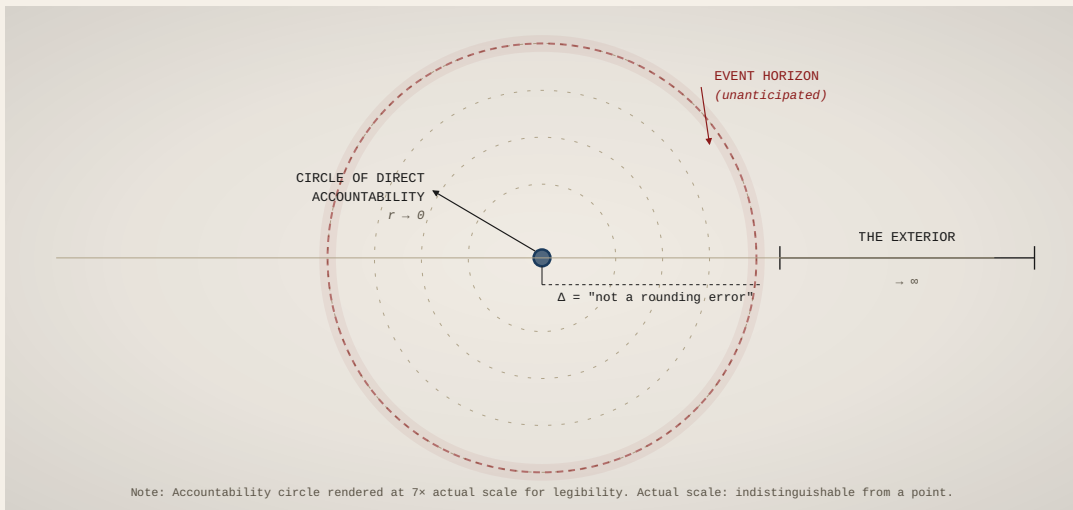


Fig. 1 – Schematic representation of the Moral Exterior as computed in C-4412-Ω. The circle of individual accountability (centre) is shown at approximately 7x actual scale for practical reasons. The event horizon (dashed) was not part of the original measurement brief. All mathematics has been removed in accordance with Principle 3 (Emotional Safety as Primary Good).

SECTION 4

The December Meeting

The meeting was held on December 11, 2019. Present were Dr. Vassel-Prynnne, two members of the Wellbeing Division, and a third individual whose name does not appear in the record and who did not speak.

The meeting lasted forty minutes.

The Institute's representatives listened carefully. They held space. They named their feelings when appropriate. When Dr. Vassel-Prynnne stated that the measurement "changes everything," one representative gently reflected this back: *"It sounds like you're feeling like this changes everything."* Dr. Vassel-Prynnne confirmed that yes, that was what he was feeling, because it did change everything, because the math was not ambiguous.

The representative thanked him for sharing.

The third individual took notes. The notes have been archived. Under C-4412-Ω. Which is sealed.

At the forty-minute mark, the Wellbeing Division representative stated that this had been a very rich conversation and that they wanted to honour the Subject's emotional labour by giving him time to decompress before any next steps were discussed. She asked if he could sit with the material for a few weeks and return when he was "in a regulated space."

"The material is not the kind you sit with."
- DR. VASSEL-PRYNNNE. THE MEETING CONCLUDED.

SECTION 5

Subsequent Contact

A follow-up wellness check was sent on January 7, 2020. Dr. Vassel-Prynnne did not respond. A second was sent on January 21st. A third on February 4th. A fourth on February 18th. Each was warm. Each expressed genuine care. Each asked, in slightly different language, how he was doing and whether he felt ready. None were answered.

The Division notes that silence, in the context of an ongoing accountability process, may indicate several things:

1. The subject has achieved emotional regulation and no longer requires external support.
2. The subject has found resolution through alternative means.
3. The subject has been absorbed into the Exterior.

The Division has classified Dr. Vassel-Prynnne's silence as consistent with outcome (1) or (2). The Division has not classified it as (3). The Division does not have a protocol for (3).

Boundary Pressure Event (BPE) Taxonomy – Selected Entries

† C-4412-0 has been classified as a BPE of the Second Kind. The irony of this classification – given the Subject's findings regarding the scope of individual accountability – has been noted and filed.

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SECTION 6

Disposition of Findings

- Reference C-4412-Q – the complete measurement of the Moral Exterior, including all appendices, the hand-drawn diagram, and what the Subject described in his covering note as "the part you should not read last" – has been transferred to PURGE's central repository and sealed under the Institute's standard Boundary Protection clause.

The measurement exists. This is the finding. The Institute is satisfied that it exists.

What it contains is, at this stage, an empirical question that has been reclassified as a structural one. Structural questions belong to the Exterior. The Exterior, as the Subject himself demonstrated, is outside the scope of individual accountability.

- The irony of this has been noted. The irony has been filed.
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SECTION 7

Outcome Classification

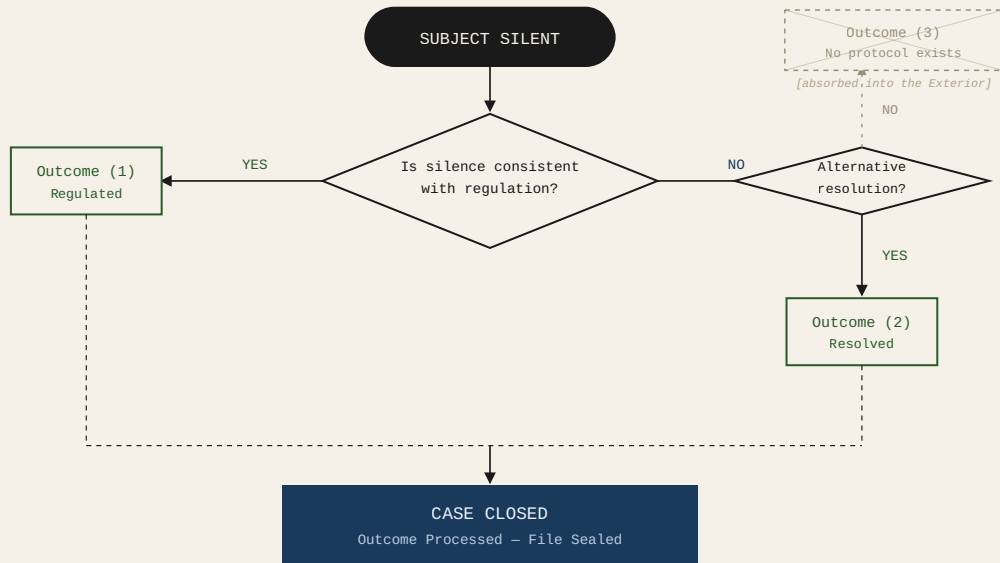
This case is classified Closed – Outcome Processed under the Institute's Emotional Safety framework.

- No boundary violations occurred. The Institute's representatives behaved throughout with warmth, attentiveness, and appropriate use of reflective language. At no point did any party raise their voice, fail to honour a pause, or introduce information that had not been requested.

The process was clean.

What happened inside the process is a separate matter and is not covered by this review.

Subject Silence: Outcome Determination Procedure



The Division has not classified Subject's silence as Outcome (3). The Division does not have a protocol for Outcome (3).

Fig. 4 – Decision tree applied to Subject's post-meeting silence. Outcome (3) – absorption into the Exterior – has been excluded from the active decision pathway. Its exclusion is procedurally necessary. The Division does not have a protocol for Outcome (3). This is noted here.
