

Hurricane Disaster Kit checklist

General Supplies:

- ☐ Batteries
- ☐ Flashlights or led lanterns (candles not recommended because it's a fire hazard)
- ☐ Lighter, or matches
- ☐ Hand cranked or battery-powered weather radio
- ☐ Several power-banks (optimally a solar-powered or hand-cranked one)
- ☐ Cash
- ☐ Cell phone Chargers
- ☐ Books, games, and other non-electronic activities for entertainment
- ☐ Rain gear (umbrellas, rain coats, rain boots)
- ☐ Sturdy shoes and work gloves
- ☐ Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- ☐ Sleeping bag, or blankets
- ☐ Fire extinguisher
- ☐ Local maps
- ☐ List of important phone numbers (county emergency number, friends/family, evacuation sites, doctors, banks, etc)
- ☐ Important documents and keys in a portable waterproof container (social security, banking info, medical records, insurance cards, birth certificate, etc)

Food/Water:

- ☐ Minimum 7 day supply of non-perishable, shelf stable food
- ☐ Baby formula
- ☐ Water for minimum of 3-7 days (1 gallon per person per day.)
 - Tip: buy several 3-5 gallon jugs to refill & reuse each hurricane season
 - Tip: Go to a local water filling station such as Twice the Ice, Watermill, or Primo water to fill your own water jugs (sometimes available in grocery stores)
- ☐ Non-electric can opener
- ☐ Disposable plates, cups, napkins, & utensils
- ☐ Cooler and ice-packs

Hygiene & cleaning:

- ☐ Soap
- ☐ Toothpaste, and mouthwash
- ☐ Disinfectant wipes
- ☐ Hand sanitizer
- ☐ Moistened wipes (baby wipes)
- ☐ Diapers
- ☐ Menstrual pads
- ☐ A few pairs of clean clothes
- ☐ Trash bags
- ☐ Paper towels

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- ☐ Facial tissues
- ☐ Toilet paper
- ☐ Fill bathtubs, or large bins with water for hygiene, cleaning, and flushing

First-Aid:

- ☐ First aid manual
- ☐ Band-aids, or gauze and medical tape
- ☐ Scissors
- ☐ Tweezers
- ☐ Two-week supply of all medicine, and prescriptions. Recommended medicines:
 - ☐ Pain relievers
 - ☐ Anti-diarrhea medicine
 - ☐ laxatives
- ☐ Rubbing alcohol, or hydrogen peroxide
- ☐ antiseptic
- ☐ Thermometer
- ☐ Safety pins
- ☐ Petroleum jelly
- ☐ Cotton balls
- ☐ Q-tips
- ☐ Disposable gloves
- ☐ Face or dust masks
- ☐ Bug repellent
- ☐ Sunblock

Pets:

- ☐ Food and water for at least 7 days
 - 1 quart to 1 gallon per animal per day depending on species & size
- ☐ Medical records, microchip info, or IDs
- ☐ Carrier, or cage
- ☐ Leash
- ☐ Medication
- ☐ Water and food bowls
- ☐ Service animal supplies

Vehicle:

- ☐ Keep car gas tank filled
- ☐ Gas for generator in approved container
